

Robbins Announces \$1 Million+ in Funding For KRIP

State Senator Bob Robbins announced this past week the approval of \$1,019,000 in state funds through the Water Supply and Wastewater Infrastructure program (PennWorks) for Phase I development of a water supply and distribution system at the Keystone Regional Industrial Park in Greenwood Township, Crawford County. This development will assist in making the site shovel ready for prospective future tenants with the intention of job creation for our region.

In November, Senator Robbins announced the approval of a \$174,800 state grant to help pay for developing a water supply plan, environmental assessment and a comprehensive master plan for the site. "I am pleased that I've been able to secure major funding through the Commonwealth Financing Authority since it was created," Robbins said. "This is part of an aggressive effort to keep jobs in Crawford County and bring in new employment opportunities. When my legislative colleagues and I voted to create the Commonwealth Financing Authority, it wasn't simply for projects in major metropolitan areas, but for communities like ours," said Robbins. The \$1,019,000 in state funding is expected to leverage federal dollars totaling over \$650,000 to complete the Phase I water system project at the park.
